Anyone Interested in learning New Job skills Our training is available to anyone seeking new job skills and greater earning ability. Backed in part by government grants, our programs are exceptionally robust and deliver excellent results. In fact, more than 80% of our graduates find and keep work in their field of training! The ASET Centers are approved by the CA Bureau for Private Post-Secondary Education (currently under "Verification of Exempt" status). All courses are listed in the CA Employment Development Department's Eligible Training Provider List (ETPL). The ETPL is a list of training providers in California who are eligible to receive Workforce Innovation Opportunity Act (WIOA) funds for training services provided to adults and dislocated workers.
